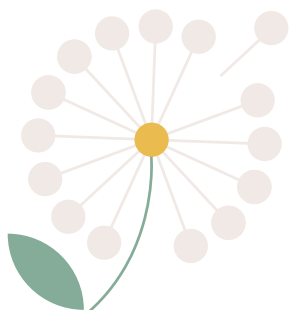

Our Curriculum



“Curriculum” can be a confusing word when your child is still in nappies or figuring out which shoe goes on which foot, but the truth is, Early childhood is about more than care; it is about laying the foundation for future learning through strong relationships, curiosity, and carefully planned experiences that build essential skills.

At New Shoots, our curriculum serves as the framework that guides our kaiako in supporting your child’s learning. And because decades of research have shown that play is the best way for young brains to develop, our curriculum is built around play.

Celebrating the magic of play

Play isn’t just something children do; it’s how they make sense of the world. It’s how they connect, express themselves, and discover who they are. And at New Shoots, it’s the thread that runs through our days.

Behind every playful moment is a clear purpose. Our kaiako plan experiences that strengthen language, problem-solving, and early literacy and numeracy through the joy of play.

From mixing mud potions to building block castles, play is full of purpose. These early experiences of imagination and exploration lay the foundation for lifelong skills such as resilience, empathy, and determination.

A life-long love of learning starts here

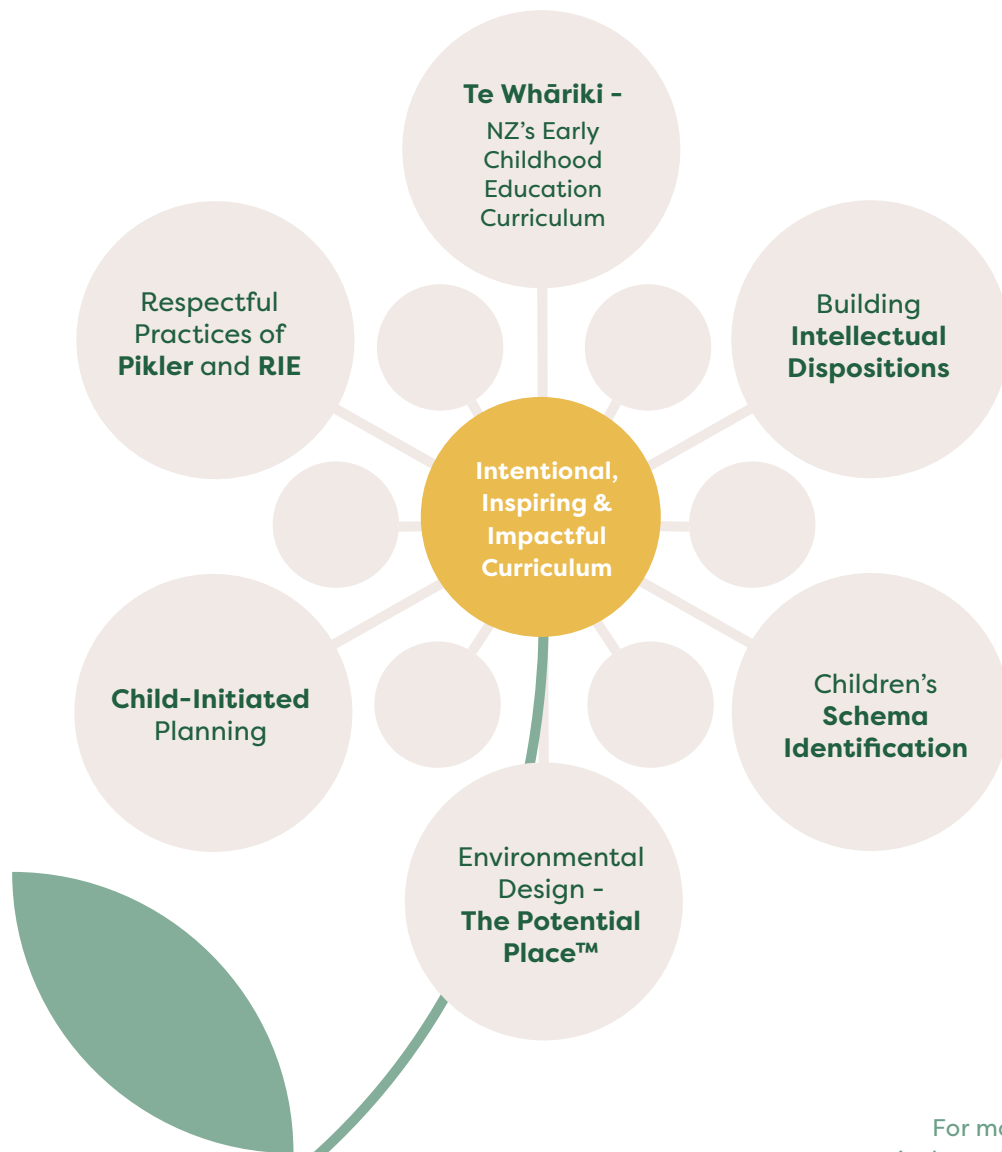
At New Shoots, we nurture curious, capable learners from their earliest days. Our curriculum is grounded in Te Whāriki, Aotearoa New Zealand’s early childhood education framework, and comes to life in our nature-rich environments, guided by skilled, caring kaiako.

As your tamariki grow, early literacy and numeracy are woven into storytelling, song, and exploration. We follow your child’s lead, and while “assessment” might sound like a big word for preschoolers, in early childhood education, it simply means paying close attention to what your child enjoys, how they’re developing, and how we can support them to keep learning with confidence.

Our curriculum nurtures the skills and dispositions that set children up for school and for life, including curiosity, independence, focus, and the ability to work and play alongside others.

Behind all the fun and play, a thoughtful mix of early childhood education research guides how we foster your child's learning and development. These educational theories form the basis of our curriculum:

PURPOSEFULLY DESIGNED AND LOVINGLY RESTORED ECE SPACES

Created in collaboration with architects, spatial designers, engineers, landscape architects, and early childhood educators, each New Shoots centre is one of a kind. Every element — colour, form, shape, and material — is carefully chosen to create spaces that reflect the diverse cultures, languages, and identities of our whānau and wider communities.

OUTSTANDING OUTDOOR AREAS

At New Shoots, we believe in biophilic design: the philosophy that nature makes us feel better. Through plants, colour palettes, and organic materials, our indoor environments connect tamariki to the natural world, and they flow seamlessly into the lush outdoor areas beyond.

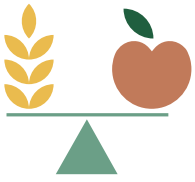
PASSIVE BUILDING DESIGN

Each centre is oriented to maximise natural daylight, reducing the need for artificial lighting. We also use passive ventilation methods, helping limit infection and reduce CO2 build-up.

RESPONSIBLE MATERIALS

All our building materials, furniture, and learning resources are chosen to limit our environmental impact and support your child's health and wellbeing. That includes using the lowest VOC (solvent) levels possible.





Nutrition

Walk through our doors and you might be greeted by the scent of freshly baked muffins or a curry simmering on the stove. Follow your nose and you'll find our talented on-site chef, preparing your child's morning tea, lunch, and afternoon tea, made fresh each day.

At New Shoots, our kai (food) is simple, nutritious, and full of variety, because when tamariki are well fed, everything else falls into place.

Forget the daily lunchbox scramble

We've got you covered with fresh, balanced meals made for all kinds of eaters. Whatever is on today's menu, there's a mix of familiar favourites and new flavours to explore.

We stick to seasonal ingredients and, where we can, source local New Zealand produce. It's all about wholesome food that supports growing bodies and curious minds.

A nourishing, colourful menu

You might find yourself wishing we cooked your lunch, too! Our daily menus are created by experienced chefs and reviewed by a qualified nutritionist, so you can trust what's on your child's plate.

We avoid highly processed ingredients and keep refined sugar to a minimum. Yes, there are treats (think muffins or fruit loaf), but even those are packed with goodness.

Our chefs understand early childhood habits, and even picky eaters usually find something they love. If your tamariki have any allergies or dietary needs, please let your Centre Director know. We're happy to help.

Why do we provide kai?

We want your child to flourish, and we want to make life a little easier for you, too. Food served during the day can make up around a third of your child's daily intake. So even if breakfast was rushed or last night was a tough one, you can feel confident that they've had something good to fuel their day.

And it's not just about what they eat, it's how they eat too. Surrounded by their peers at child-sized tables, tamariki learn to slow down, stay seated, and enjoy kai together as part of the rhythm of the day.

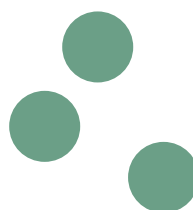
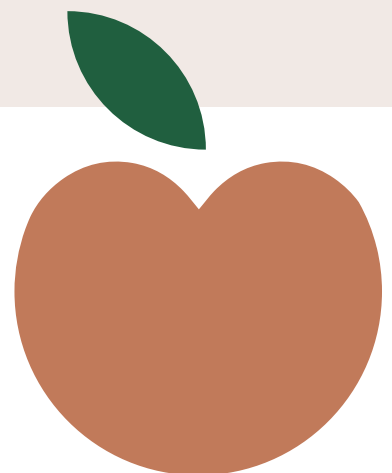

Sustainability

We want to help shape a strong future for your tamariki, and a big part of that is caring for the world they'll grow up in. Sustainability is woven into everything we do at New Shoots, from our curriculum to our cleaning products, our toys and resources to our freshly cooked meals.

We work with each centre's local environment to create meaningful, hands-on experiences with nature. Because when tamariki connect with the land, they grow into confident, capable kaitiaki (guardians) of the natural world.

Nurture through nature

Whether they're digging dirt or picking fruit, tamariki come alive when they're immersed in the natural world. While every centre is unique, here are some of the nature-based initiatives you might find:

- Worm farms that turn food scraps into fertiliser for our whānau gardens
- Kura ngahere (bush kindy), giving tamariki time to explore, connect with, and learn from the land
- Enviroschools where your tamariki learn how to take action in their communities.
- On-site Gardens and/or Orchards that grow fresh fruit and vegetables, used in daily meals or sent home for whānau to enjoy!



Curated with care

Safe for tamariki, gentle on the planet is our philosophy for every item we welcome into the centre. You'll find cots and equipment free from BPA, phthalates, and lead; toys made from natural fibres and safe, plant-based dyes; materials like wood, stone, and clay; and second-hand treasures that spark creativity while reducing waste.

Everyday actions, long term impact

Small, consistent choices make a big impact over time. That's why we:

- Use eco-friendly cleaning products that are safe for tamariki and the planet
- Partner with leading New Zealand waste companies to recycle as much as possible
- Source staff uniforms from a local, ethical supplier

Whānau Support Kaiako

The role of your kaiako

You and your child will be matched with a Whānau Support Kaiako. Their role is to build a close, trusting relationship with your whānau to enable your child to connect with their new environment. This bond is built on consistency, continuity, care, safety, and trust, and will be supported by all members of our team. You will also have a back-up kaiako for when your Whānau Support Kaiako is away.

Your Whānau Support Kaiako is the secure base from which your tamariki can explore. They'll answer any questions you have about your child's day and ensure you're comfortable with the love and care your child receives at New Shoots.

Why we do this

At New Shoots, we know that strong relationships are the foundation for every child's learning and wellbeing. Starting at a new centre can be a big step, and having one special kaiako who truly knows your child helps them feel secure, understood, and ready to explore.

This approach supports emotional safety and confidence, allowing tamariki to build meaningful connections with others and engage deeply in play and learning. It also gives parents and whānau peace of mind, knowing there is someone who understands their child's routines, interests, and unique way of being.



Settling your Child

A child's first day in a new environment is a big step and while some tamariki embark with confidence, others take more time and need extra support.

We recommend a settling-in period with whānau present to help your child adapt happily to their new surroundings. We suggest at least three visits before their first booked day. The length of time and number of visits is different for every child.

There's no rush; we want to make sure you and your tamariki are confident in your chosen centre and allow time for bonding with your kaiako. We will work alongside you to meet the needs of your tamariki and establish a strong line of communication.



Ways to help your tamariki settle at New Shoots:

- Discuss New Shoots with your tamariki and visit multiple times before their first day so they know what to expect.
- It is important to say goodbye to them. If you suddenly disappear, they may become more anxious about staying as they have not been told you will return.
- When settling let them take a special toy or possession if it will help them feel more comfortable.
- Spend quality time with your child after picking them up. Ask them what they did and how they felt.
- Provide your Whānau Support Kaiako with your child's specific needs, including routines and moods.
- Call us as often as you need to. They'll soon be engaged in activities and feeling quite at home.
